

Water level still alarming



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More flood is likely to wreak havoc if the incessant rains are any indication. Incessant rains refuse to halt forcing the water [level](#) of the [Brahmaputra](#) and its tributaries to flow above the [danger level](#).

The [Brahmaputra](#) is still flowing above the [danger](#) mark at Nematighat in Jorhat. The Sankosh was flowing above [danger](#) mark at Golokganj in Dhubri.

Lakhimpur is worst hit district where [over](#) 50,000 people have been rendered homeless during the last ten days. This is followed by Barpeta where [over](#) 2,300 people being trapped.

Other flood hit districts include Bongaigaon, Lakhimpur and Baksa, Dhemaji, [Morigaon](#), Jorhat, [Tinsukia](#) and Dhubri where flood fury has taken three lives.

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
