

## Workshop on 'Media and Environment' at Nameri

The participants were taken to Pigmy Hog Conservation Programme attached to Eco Camp site for on spot study of of the endangered species.

It needs mention that Eco Camp, Nameri has been guiding nature loving people around the globe to venture into Nameri National Park for years and has been well-marked as a getaway for nature lovers and bird watchers. Bird watchers can watch 370 species of birds in the park. Besides the Eco Camp offers facilities like rafting down the Jia Bhorolu river.
